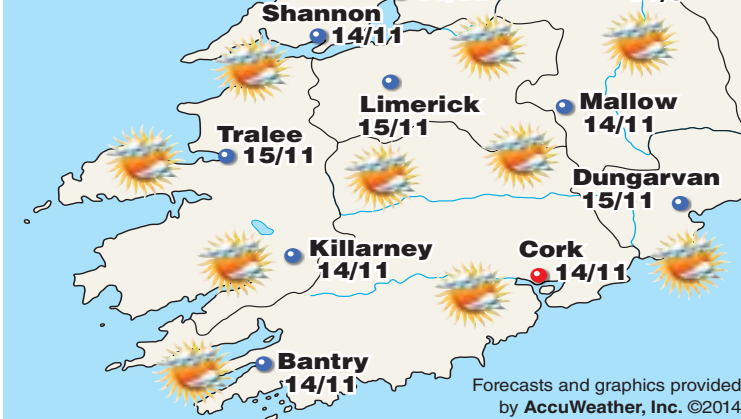

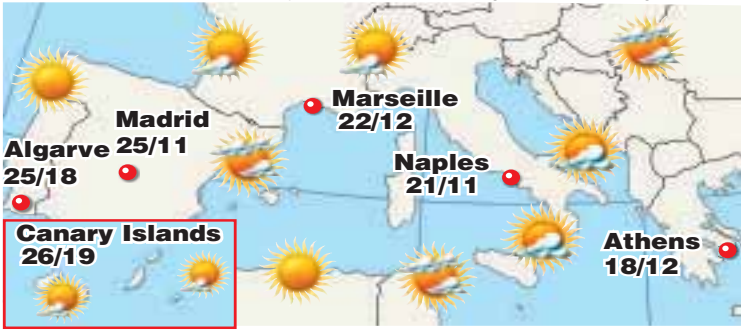

Drive-in marks fourth birthday

MOVIE JUNCTION in Carrigtwohill will be holding a special fund-raiser to mark its fourth birthday over the midterm break.

The country's only drive-in cinema teamed up with the Firkin Crane's 'Spooktacular' dancers and Keary's Mini to announced details of the fund-raiser which will take place on Saturday November 1.

The chosen charities are Glansillagh Animal Rescue, Glanmire and Community Cats Network, Middleton, both of which were chosen because they face mounting vet bills and running cost which threaten their future.

It's a timely campaign, as rescue centres often have to deal with dogs and cats at Halloween who are burned by bonfires or lost because they become afraid because of fireworks and wander off.

Ellie Redmond, owner, Movie Junction said: "We wanted to do something special to mark our 4th anniversary and what better way than to raise money for Glansillagh Animal Rescue and Community Cats Network which both do amazing work.

"Animal rescues are under extra strain at this time of year so we hope to raise awareness of their outstanding work while also highlighting the extra need to keep pets indoors and away from fireworks and bonfires this Halloween."

"Our aim is to raise as much as possible for the centres while creating extra fun for kids," she added.

There will be free face painting at the Movie Junction site in Carrigtwohill.

Ms Redmond said she is encouraging kids to dress up with their pets and teddies in Halloween costumes throughout the midterm and come along to enjoy drive-in films.

At special screenings on Thursday and Saturday of next week, a 15 donation will be made from every 25 tucket sold on-line, or Move Junction will make a 4 donation per car.

Thursday's screenings are Disney's 'Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day' and Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles while Saturday will be new release "The Book of Life".

The Bones of Cork play home gig

CORK band The Bones of Cork will play a rare gig on home turf this back holiday weekend, as part of the Guinness Jazz Festival.

The band was formed to play at the official closing ceremony of Cork 2005 European Capital of Culture.

This weekend, they'll be in same place for the first time in five years, and will play at Coughlan's bar on Sunday night at 9pm. As well as favourites, they will play new arrangements by Cormac McCarthy and Paul Frost.

The line up consists of Michael Marshall, Eoghan Kelly, Eoin Nash, Paul Dunlea on Trombones Paul Frost on Bass Trombone With

Steve Kelly (Drums) Phil Collins (Piano), and Rory Dempsey (Bass).

Following on from Cork 2005, the group went on to play a number of high profile gigs including Cork Jazz Festival in 2006 and 2007; the Lord Mayors Gala Charity Concert and the inaugural concert in Evelyn Grant's Open House series at the Cork School of Music.

Individually the members of the group have played with artists as diverse as Phil Woods, Curtis Fuller, Benny Golson, Buddy Greco, Sir John Dankworth, Rufus Reid, Tim Garland, Syd Lawrence Orchestra, Glenn Miller UK Big Band and the Back To Basie Big Band.
